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

Get the whole gang active in the great outdoors! Hike familyfriendly trails among wild ponies at **Grayson Highlands State Park**. Split your time between sandy beaches and mountain vistas at **Hungry Mother State Park**.

Spark young curiosity by exploring Smyth County's rich history and culture! See a woolly mammoth and find out how

salt played a crucial role in the Civil War at the Museum of the Middle Appalachians in Saltville. Stop by Blue Ridge Discovery Center and learn all about the rich biodiversity of your majestic surroundings while planning your next adventure.

Experience the county's rich musical heritage at the historic **Lincoln Theatre** in Marion.

If current culture is more your family's style, a vibrant community of artists, artisans and musicians make the options too plentiful to list, from fine art galleries to farmers' market booths, and from nationally broadcast musical performances to impromptu bluegrass jams.

When it's time to cut loose and have fun, you won't have far to look! Cool down in Saltville's **Hardy Roberts Memorial Wave Pool** or the new splash pad at the **Marion Water Park**. Plan an evening of putt putt, arcade games, and a movie at **Park Place Drive-In Theater**.

Or, slow the pace with a stroll down **Main Street** in Marion and soak in the charming, vibrant small town atmosphere. Sample some treats at **Hester's Country Store and Fudgery**, browse a vintage toy store, and take a photo in front of Marion's LOVEwork.



ADD SOME ALTITUDE TO YOUR ADVENTURE



Set against the backdrop of the highest peaks in Virginia, Smyth County is your basecamp for outdoor fun

DAY 1: Kick off
your adventure with
a scenic drive to
Skulls Gap Overlook
near Chilhowie. This
small overlook packs
a punch, offering
panoramic views
and the trailhead for
the extensive Iron
Mountain Trail. Make
a stop at Blue Ridge
Discovery Center

in Konnarock, then head back to Chilhowie to stroll the boutiques and antique stores of the newly restored historic district. **DAY 2:** You're in for an exhilarating and challenging hike to Molly's Knob, located in **Hungry Mother State Park**. The reward is worth the climb, with nearly 1000 feet of elevation gain on this 1.6 mile hike to the top. You'll be mesmerized by the mountain views at the summit, and enjoy catching your breath on the two benches welcoming hikers who met the challenge. Afterwards, make your way to **downtown Marion** for dinner, or a pint at **36° Fifty Brewing**.

DAY 3: Head over to the historic town of **Saltville** to explore the **Well Fields**, the only inland saline marshes in Virginia. Free birding and history guides are available at the Museum of the Middle Appalachians. Pack your kayak to explore nearby Laurel Bed Lake, or take a stroll on the Salt Trail, a converted rail-trail that begins in the heart of downtown Saltville.

DAY 4: Set your sights on the highest peak in Virginia with a hike to Mount Rogers (5,728 ft). Start your summit-bagging quest in **Grayson Highlands State Park**. The hike to the top will lead you through mountain meadows with wild ponies, rocky outcroppings and highland balds. Pack a picnic lunch, then recharge on the way home with ice cream at **The Farmhouse Market** in Sugar Grove.

BONUS: Check off Virginia's second highest peak with a visit to nearby Whitetop Mountain!



AUTHENTICALLY APPALACHIAN



Small-town charm and southern hospitality are where Smyth County shines. Here, you'll find farm-to-fork food, artwork, local spirits, and handcrafts that are distinctly Appalachian.

In local music venues, traditional old time music sits comfortably next to its cousins: bluegrass and country. Get a front row seat to the heritage music at a recording of the famous PBS series **Song of the Mountains** at **The Lincoln Theatre in Marion**, or sit in on a weekly Friday Night Jam at Palmer Mill in Saltville.

For those who want to get hands-on, visit The Wayne C. Henderson School for Appalachian Arts. Named after world famous luthier Wayne Henderson, it offers immersive classes in Appalachian craftsmanship. Build a guitar or fiddle, or learn letterpress, pottery and quilting. Music lovers of all kinds should check out the event calendar during their visit to Smyth County for summer concert series in Chilhowie's Town Park and Downtown Marion, among others.

The beauty of our mountains have historically fostered the ingenuity of free spirits and artisans. In Marion, you'll find a fusion of traditional styles and contemporary arts at **The Ford Studios**, and a cooperative of regional artists who make their home at The **Appalachian Spirit Gallery**. Our bustling weekly farmers markets in Chilhowie and Marion are a great place to browse local arts and crafts, and sample homemade goodies!

You'll find culinary artists crafting the region's bounty and traditional food items into their menus at local restaurants. Enjoy a farm tour, or pick up farm products straight from the source at Laurel Springs Farm Mercantile in Marion.

For a taste of authentic Appalachia, sample the moonshine at Highlands Distilling Company, made with a traditional recipe and distilling methods. The local libations are expertly crafted at 36° Fifty Brewing, where you'll find an impressive selection of craft beers, while Davis Valley Winery & Distillery offers a refined winery experience at its hilltop tasting room.

SMALL TOWNS, BIG HISTORY

Smyth County's communities are packed with history that you can still experience today.

CHILHOWIE

A historical marker notes that Chilhowie was once the westernmost point of the United States. Pronounced Chil-how-whee, a Cherokee word meaning "valley of many deer," the town became a stagecoach stop along the famous Wilderness Road, a trail originally forged by herds of buffalo, then officially blazed through the Cumberland Gap by Daniel Boone. Officially incorporated in 1913, Chilhowie still boasts beautiful turn of the century architecture in the recently restored historic district, listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Don't miss the exhibits at the Smyth County Visitor Center, located in the historic H.L. Bonham House.

MARION

Marion is a certified National and Virginia Main Street Community. Enjoy the vibrant downtown with a self guided walking tour from the **Smyth County Historical**



Society & Museum on Main St. Be sure to pop inside The Lincoln Theatre. Originally built as "the finest movie palace in the region," it now offers live performances in a gorgeous Mayan Revival style theatre. Pop-culture lovers will be excited to know Marion also played a crucial role in the development of Mountain Dew.

Nearby **Hungry Mother State Park** was built in the 1930s by the Civilian Conservation Corps. Head to the Discovery Center to learn more about its history, then book a stay in one of the original CCC cabins!

SALTVILLE

Saltville can lay claim to over 30,000 years of history, from prehistory through the modern industrial age, including



two major Civil War battles fought over the saltworks here. The natural salt deposits not only attracted prehistoric mammals, they've also made this town a popular eco-destination. Birders flock to the saltwater marshes of the Well Fields, and hikers enjoy the unique canyons of the nearby Channels Natural Area Preserve. Head to the Museum of the Middle Appalachians to view the bones of prehistoric mammals and learn how the American chemical industry began in Southwest Virginia.

PLAN A PERFECT ROAD TRIP

Wanderlust is defined as a strong desire to travel, but here in Virginia, we call that feeling **WanderLove**. We've compiled a list of adventure-filled stops to add to your next road trip.

Bag A Peak Without Leaving Your Car

Head out on the **Mount Rogers Scenic Byway** for gorgeous mountain foliage, stopping at some of Southwest Virginia's gems like **Grayson Highlands State Park** and **Blue Ridge Discovery Center**. Take a side trip up Rt. 600 to reach the summit of Whitetop Mountain (Virginia's second highest peak). No hiking required!

Tackle hairpin curves on The Back of the Dragon

Head north from Marion on Rt. 16, known as **The Back of the Dragon**. Popular with motorcyclists and driving enthusiasts, the Dragon boasts 438 curves in 32 miles. Be sure to stop at the Staley Overlook just a few miles north of **Hungry Mother State Park**, for breathtaking views of Rich Valley.

Nosh on Nostalgia at Retro Eateries

For classic road trip fare, visit the famous **Dip Dog Stand**, where they've been serving up onion rings, shakes, and iconic Dip Dogs since 1957. In Saltville, grab a footlong hotdog at the beloved **Buck's Drive-In** and grab a seat at a picnic table next to a local. There's plenty of sweet treats available at Hester's Country Store & Fudgery, or treat yourself to hand-scooped ice cream and a movie at **Park Place Drive-In**.



Feel the Love

Virginia is for Lovers, and Smyth County is home to two of the iconic Virginia LOVEworks. Popular for its seasonal decorations, the **Smyth County Visitors Center LOVEwork** is located in front of the historic H.L. Bonham House. The **LOVEwork in downtown Marion** is located in Hurricane Alley just off of Main Street, inviting visitors to stop and share some love with their favorite people.

AN INSIDER'S GUIDE TO SMYTH COUNTY

We asked locals to tell us their favorite places to take visitors. Some may surprise you!

Just south of Marion is the **Octagon House**, built in the shape of - you guessed it - a perfect octagon. A non-profit foundation is slowly restoring this unusual antebellum home. The building is not safe to enter, but interpretive signs tell its fascinating story.

Head to Saltville to meet Woolly the animatronic mammoth, and her sidekick Lil' Salty. She's usually hanging around the **Museum of the Middle Appalachians**, but the last weekend of January, she heads to the Town Commons for Woolly Day, to predict whether there will be 8 more weeks of winter.

Take a behind the scenes tour of **The Lincoln Theatre**, one of only three existing Mayan Revival-style theatres in America.

visit - it even inspired a poem by a passing traveler!

Whether you call it a hellbender, a mud puppy or a snot otter, you've got to check out this gentle giant of the amphibian world at **Hungry Mother State Park**. Despite its somewhat terrifying name, hellbenders are not dangerous. In fact, they are actually a threatened species due to pollution and habitat loss. Meet Hungar the Hellbender at the Discovery Center in

the park, and learn how you can help protect native species.

Discover hidden trails with less traffic. A short gravel trail

starts at the **Smyth County Visitor Center** in Chilhowie, to the delight of passing motorists looking to stretch their legs.

At its west end, it crosses the Holston River via an elevated

footbridge to end in Town Park. This hidden trail is worth a





The murals were painted by the scandalous artist and flapper, Lola Poston. Bonus: walk next door to the **General Francis**Marion Hotel, where Lola might have enjoyed a cocktail. The black rooster mosaic was a code during Prohibition, letting quests know they could order alcohol.

Just outside of Saltville, Big Tumbling Creek offers numerous waterfalls, plus superb trout fishing in the deep rocky pools. Note: the waterfalls are managed by Virginia Department of Wildlife Resources, and requires a current fishing or boating license to access, even if you don't fish.
